Also known as the Italian Association of Constructors, it is part of a network whose activities began in 1953 with the first fields of work for the reconstruction of houses destined for refugees in the Second World War. Situation of the country or area	<p>The Tanzanian economy has recorded a growth rate of over 6% in the last 5 years. However, the benefits of this growth are not equally shared among the population and there are still strong internal imbalances where the 20% richer of Tanzanians represents 42% of total consumption while the poorest 20% represents only 7% of consumption. Tanzania is among the Least Developed Countries in the OECD DAC list and among the countries with low human development index (151th in the HDR20164 ranking).</p> <p>Among the population most at risk are people with disabilities who have worse socio-economic conditions than the general population in a wide range of areas including: lower literacy and schooling rates and fewer job opportunities.</p> <p>The condition of women and girls with disabilities is even worse. The literacy rate for women with disabilities in developing countries is 1%.</p> <p>According to the 2008 National Disability Survey, people with disabilities above 7 years represent 7.8% of the population in Tanzania and 8.3% in rural areas. Official data are still few and probably underestimate the real dimension of the problem.</p> <p>A study carried out in Tanzania in 2015 shows that one in 10 families has a member with disabilities. Such families are more likely to have serious health problems, are poorer on average, often do not have any assistance aid and are not enrolled in a social protection program due to the indifference of government staff and lack of awareness of own rights.</p> <p>The most frequent causes that lead to disability are related to problems related to childbirth (inadequacy of assistance or harmful interventions), domestic accidents or genetic inheritance. Disabled children are often forced to lead a precarious life, because they are subject to negligence and neglect. False popular beliefs and recourse to traditional healers have negative consequences on health. In the territory there is no social support for families with disabled children. Traditionally children with disabilities, especially those affected by mental</p>

	<p>retardation, are considered a misfortune and a disgrace for their family and parents sometimes tend to hide them at home and deny them proper care.</p> <p>The local partner, Nyumba Ali Association, since 2003 deals with child disability in Iringa (Tanzania): manages 2 rehabilitation centers, recognized training courses, hippotherapy and alternative augmentative communication program.</p> <p>The city of Iringa is the main urban center of the homonymous region located in the central-southern part of Tanzania. Since 2005, the administrative organization in force distinguishes the area in two districts, Iringa Urban and Iringa Rural; the following data refer to the entire urban and rural area as a whole.</p> <p>The projections contained in the last census of 2002 and relating to the year 2012 show that the two districts together should have roughly 398,000 inhabitants, with a population density ranging from 14 ab / km² in rural areas to 775 inhab ./km² in the urban area. The average annual growth rate of the population would therefore be 1.5%. This intervention aims to facilitate access to rehabilitation services.</p>

<p>Detailed program of the activity</p>	<p>Implementation of therapeutic paths for children with disabilities at the two Nyumba Ali day centers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Collection and evaluation of the requests for insertion in the day centers of children with disabilities by the families on the basis of the following criteria: psycho - physical condition of the child, situation of economic need of the family and availability by the mother to take part in the therapeutic path ; • Organization and planning for each minor of weekly sessions; • Daily organization of morning transport for minors with disabilities from their homes to the reference center and back via a minibus service provided by the center; • Elaboration of personalized rehabilitation courses through physical exercises, mobilizations, interlocking games to stimulate the cognitive part, ambulation, rolling and ball games adapting them to the individual psycho - physical condition of the child; • Regular monitoring of the progress made by children through the biweekly update of each child's personal card. <p>Implementation of non-formal education activities and school support for minors of the Family Home</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • design and implementation of simple non formal educational activities (such as manual workshops, evening cineforum) with
