Celebrities play a pivotal role in contemporary media culture, functioning not only as commercial icons but also as cultural intermediaries who help shape public discourse. While much has been written on their social functions and audience relations, less critical attention has been given to ageing celebrities and to the shifting cultural meanings of celebrity in the post-career phase. As their presence expands across film, television, and digital media, ageing celebrities increasingly embody alternative narratives that challenge traditional associations of ageing with decline and invisibility.

This transformation mirrors broader demographic and cultural changes, as ageing becomes a prominent social factor influencing economies, lifestyles, and values. In the post-career stage, celebrity figures often engage in new forms of visibility — sharing personal stories, embracing vulnerability, or becoming advocates for social causes — which allow them to renegotiate their symbolic capital. Their trajectories invite interdisciplinary reflection on how fame, ageing, and media intersect in redefining later life within today’s cultural imagination.
