


The first patient

The First Patient is the title of the graphic book, containing 6 graphic novels and 6 anatomical illustrations, totally dedicated to the explanation and divulgation of the whole-body donation topic for the purpose of scientific research and medical-surgical education.

The book was realized as part of the **Body Donation** project and raises the unprecedented and interdisciplinary collaboration between the Department of Biomedicine and Neuromotor Sciences, the Department of Sociology of the University of Bologna and the Department of Design and Applied Arts of the Academy of Fine Arts of Bologna. All the involved researchers have provided mutual expertise and resources. In addition to the dissemination and production of the book, the project aims to present the social and anthropological components involved in the donation.

Recently, Graphic novels, as a multi-code language with vast narrative possibilities, have been rediscovered in the field of science and social dissemination.








Illustration engages the reader in a dimension of imaginative exploration that has always stood alongside realism, allowing the consolidation and enhancement of learning experience.













How can we reach the non-scientific readers about a topic that is so sensitive and poorly known?

Through the donor

The donor is the starting point of the graphic narrative. The gift made by donating his/her body, the motivations for doing so, and the path that must be followed in order to "carry out" the donation, are one of the focuses around which the stories in the volume are centered.



For these reasons, the volume is based on 6 graphic novels written by ABABO students in collaboration with the teachers supervising the project and based on the scientific and sociological research material gathered during a year. As Will Eisner said, fiction and information hand in hand can go a long way.








































Under the supervision of an interdisciplinary editorial team of Anatomists, Sociologists, Graphic novelists, Comic authors and Artists the entire book is structured around six stories that were created by students a salacted among the 30 people who is interded.

Students – selected among the 30 people who joined the project, – of the three-year Comics and Illustration program, the two-year Comics Language program, and the two-year Illustration for Publishing program.

Students were assisted by well-known graphic novelists and illustration authors who have studied at ABABO and continue to weave projects with it. The guest authors were Alessandro Pastore, Federico Gaddi and Marco Libardi. The students, are now in the process of writing and storyboarding their individual projects.









