The ultimate aim of this WP is the **implementation of international relations offices in the MM partner universities.**

The specific goals of this WP:

- Building up an awareness of IROs' strategic role in promoting internationalization;
- Exposing MM partners to different models of international relations management;
- Enhancing MM partners' capacity in designing their own IROs;
- Supporting MM partners to implement their IROs.



WP 4: CHINLONE international relations platform

TIMELINE:

- Each MM partner university appoints their **contact persons** to ulrica.ouline@uadm.uu.se. **Deadline January 25, 2020**.
- Bologna and Granada send their IRO tasks/strategies and organizational charts to UU. UU sends the EU partners documents to MM partners for inspiration[⊙]. Deadline February 1, 2020.
- **UU will collect** all draft MM partners Feasibility plans and draft Office Missions to be sent to the EU partners. **Deadline April 28, 2020.**
- The Feasibility plans and the Office Missions will be **shared with EU partners** for their feedbacks. **The EU partners' feedback will be sent to UU. Deadline May 13, 2020.**
- The feedback will be discussed during the IRO Training week in Uppsala.



- IRO Training week in Uppsala May 13-19, 2020.
- Cascade training at MM universities 2 weeks after the Uppsala visit (Early June 2020). The training will focus on the presentation of the EU models of international relations management and on the analysis of the services the European partner has implemented. MM partners can identify best practices and thus find out the most effective management solution for their own university.
- The Feasibility plans and the Office Missions are approved by MM university bodies, according to their internal decision process, then they are sent to the Ministry of Education. Deadline ? July 2020.
- The Office Mission is **published** on the university website when the IRO is implemented.



HOMEWORK: Writing the IRO Mission and the Feasibility plan

METHOD

The group working on the **Feasibility plan** has to:

- Study how to tackle budget constraints,
- Write a **budget proposal**,
- Decide the first services to be implemented and the staff required.

The group working with the **Office Mission** will show:

- How it is **consistent with the university mission** and its strategic plan.
- How the IRO is committed to accomplish the actions envisaged in the strategic plan for international relations.
- Describe the services dedicated to foster students/faculty exchange and international cooperation.
- Include the IRO in the administrative organizational chart.
