



BC main areas of cooperation & intervention in the Mediterranean

- Network of Coastal Observatories for the monitoring, management of risks and erosion phenomena, defense interventions & sediment stocks management;
- Survey of the erosion status and trends & flood hazard suitable for territorial planning and adaptation measures;
- Sustainable use of strategic resources: the coastal territory (to face the "littoralization" process) and coastal & submarine stocks of sediments (to face erosion and Climate Change impacts, favoring new market potentials at Med level);
- Integrated territorial planning & application of ICZM / MSP principles for the sustainable development of the Mediterranean coasts, landscape-environment-ecosystems protection, risk adaptation & coastal resilience;
- **Structural interventions along Med coasts** consistent with integrated planning processes, for the implementation of an adaptive policy to the natural & anthropogenic risks
- Projects-clustering for synergies, capitalization of projects achievements and further developments




