

ENCODE winter school – Würzburg, 14-17 February 2022 "Papyrology for non-specialists"

The Department of Classics at Würzburg University invites students of all levels, academics and professionals in Classics, Ancient History and Ancient Philosophy to participate in the ENCODE winter school "Papyrology for non-specialists".

The goal of the school is twofold: It is aimed both at non-specialists who seek a first introduction into papyrology and at papyrologists who are teaching papyrology to students of other subjects. We intend to present and to put into practice a range of methods to make Greek and Latin papyri accessible to the non-specialist, with a focus on digital tools and resources. In this way, we hope to provide beginners with an introduction and a possibility to meet papyrologists, and fellow papyrologists with new ideas and digital methods of teaching.
