Latin Students in EU schools: more than 3.000.000!





Different educational system

Some exemples:

- compulsory Latin in junior highschool (Romania)
- compulsory Latin for some highschools
- optional Latin for some highschools
- Latin only at university
- Latin required for university access

(between schools and universities of each country)



Eulalia Main OBJECTIVES



(1) to create a shared standard

thus facilitating the dialogue between:

- different countries (e.g. Erasmus experience)

- different levels of education (e.g.

highschool university)



(2) to improve teaching Latin

- focusing on language learning (transversal competence)

- respecting methods and traditions

 encouraging inclusion (not motherlanguage students, special needs students)
