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## 1. The FoodE Stakeholder and Advisory Board

The FoodE Stakeholder and Advisory Board (SAB) ensures the active involvement of key international stakeholders. The SAB includes representatives of public administrations (city councils, metropolitan areas, countries), schools, citizen-driven CRFS initiatives (urban farmers association, citizens and food councils, school garden working groups), researchers (HEIs), and SMEs involved in innovative CRFS.

The SAB is composed of:

Stakeholder Board:

- **COMPOSITION:** representatives of public administrations (city councils, metropolitan areas, countries), schools, CRFS initiatives, research institutes and civil society organisations.
- **ACTIVITIES:** active participation in FoodE KidScience activities and MyLocalFoodE initiatives.

Advisory Board:

- **COMPOSITION:** experts of CRF.
- **ACTIVITIES:** specific advice on project activities and results. They are also invited to specific project meetings and MyLocalFoodE initiatives.

Throughout the entire FoodE project cycle, the list was regularly updated adding new proposals from the consortium or removing old members. These proposals were thoroughly discussed and subsequently approved during the General Assembly meetings.

Stakeholder Boards were established under the coordination of HCA, spanning from M2 to M6. In each partner country, 5 stakeholder panels were formed, encompassing representatives from CRFS initiatives (SMEs, NGOs, unions), public administrators and policy makers (PAs), school committees, researchers (HEIs), and representatives from civil society (e.g., individuals, food councils, consumer organisations). The initial version of these panels was compiled by M8 (D3.2), with the most recent update conducted at M24 (D3.4). The subsequent update is scheduled for M48 (D3.5).

Each panel promoted initiatives within T3.1.3. (MyLocalFoodE Initiative) and took part in the co-design of priorities and regulations that were adopted in the open challenge for pilot design and implementation (T4.3).

As for the school committee, it comprises schools that participated in the KidScience activities (T3.3). Through KidScience, students actively participated in the FoodE project by attending open-science events alongside researchers and food systems managers. During these events, they presented sustainable CRFS concepts and collaborated on developing pioneering strategies for implementing innovative food systems in their respective regions. The students were further engaged in school competitions, challenges, hackathons, and similar activities.

The reimbursement of costs for Stakeholder Board members participating in MyLocalFoodE initiatives was directly handled by the responsible partner. UNIBO adjusted that partner's budget to incorporate these costs if they were reported and accepted by the EC. The involvement of Stakeholder Board members in MyLocalFoodE initiatives was deliberated and decided upon by the General Assembly, with decisions made on a case-by-case basis.
