

Guidelines for *Adamantius* (revised form, July 2019)

Each author, after the peer review process, is required

- 1) to send the contribution in both “doc” format and “pdf” format, taking care to adapt the text to the editorial guidelines (see below);
- 2) to give the abstract of his contribution in English language;
- 3) to give a list of at least five keywords in English language;
- 4) to give his institutional affiliation with e-mail address.

I. Fonts and characters

- **The body** of the text will be normally in font size 9 pts, including references to notes; 8 pts inside quotations and in the notes.
- **Italics** are to be used in the following situations:
 - 1) titles (works, articles, miscellaneous volumes, etc.);
 - 2) Latin expressions (*lectio difficilior*, *scil.*, *ibid.*, etc.);
 - 3) quotations from Latin texts (alternatively you can use the quotation marks «», without italics);
 - 4) words not belonging to your language;
 - 5) Latin references to manuscripts (es. *Vaticanus*, *Sinaiticus*).
- **Bold** is to be used only for sigla of manuscripts and papyri, when deemed useful.
- **Small caps** with capital initial are to be used for modern authors.
- **Fonts** must be Unicode.

Quotations and punctuation:

- In the case of quotation of texts, the following characters are to be used: «».
- In the case of a quotation occurring within another quotation, please, use: “”.
- For long quotations, please give them a deeper indent as a block quotation: please use a reduced font size and an augmented left margin, isolating the quotation from the body of your text with vertical spaces before and after the quotation. In this case «» are not to be used.
- The number referring to a note must precede punctuation.
- To indicate a particular meaning of a word (emphasis), use: ‘’.

II. Reference to literature

- Include the following information for bibliographical references:
(monograph)
 1. Name of author(s) responsible for writing the book *in small caps and capital initial*. In the case of a plurality of authors, please divide their names with the “n-dash” sign, preceded and followed by space. For example: L. PERRONE – A. CACCIARI.
 2. Full title (italic)
 - 3 When necessary, series title (if any) and volume number (if any) between parentheses: this use is mandatory when quoting editions of texts. Ex.: (SC 41)

4. Publishing house
5. City of publication. In the case of a plurality of cities, please divide them with the "n-dash" sign, preceded and followed by space.
6. Date of publication
7. Pagination expressed with full numbers: es. 174-178; **not** 174-78.

(miscellany)

1. Full title (italic)
2. Editor(s) of the miscellany. In the case of a plurality of editors, please divide their names with the "n-dash" sign, preceded and followed by space. For examples: ed. S. MORLET – M. CASSIN.
3. When necessary, series title (if any) and volume number (if any) between parentheses
4. Publishing house
5. City of publication. In the case of a plurality of cities, please divide them with the "n-dash" sign, preceded and followed by space.
6. Date of publication

(essay in miscellany)

1. Name of author(s) of the essay. In the case of a plurality of authors, please divide them with the "n-dash" sign, preceded and followed by space.
2. Full title (italic)
3. "in"
4. Full title of the miscellany (italic).
5. Editor(s) of the miscellany. In the case of a plurality of editors, please divide them with the "n-dash" sign, preceded and followed by space.
6. When necessary, series title (if any) and volume number (if any) between parentheses
7. Publishing house.
8. City of publication. In the case of a plurality of cities, please divide them with the "n-dash" sign, preceded and followed by space.
9. Date of publication
10. Pagination expressed with full numbers

(essay in journal)

1. Name of author(s) in small caps and capital initial. In the case of a plurality of authors, please divide them with the "n-dash" sign, preceded and followed by space.
2. Full title (italic)
3. Name of the journal (possibly in abbreviated form, see *infra*)
4. Volume year (between parentheses, **not** followed by semicolon)
5. Pagination expressed with full numbers: es. 174-178; **not** 174-78.

Abbreviations of names of journals and collections are to be expressed according to the system illustrated in *Theologische Realenzyklopädie. Abkürzungsverzeichnis*, ed. S.M. Schwertner, W. de Gruyter, Berlin – New York 1994², 2010³ (in the Appendix you will find only a **selection** of journals and collections). To this list you have to add:

- *Subsequent quotations*. If a work is quoted more than once, the following quotations should be in the form of a short title, followed by the indication “cit.” and, when necessary, the number of the note in which the complete bibliographical reference occurs:

D. BARTHELEMY, *Redécouverte d’un chaînon manquant*, cit., 19-21, OR, D. BARTHELEMY, *Redécouverte d’un chaînon manquant*, cit. (n. 21), 19-21 (if the reference to n. 21 is considered necessary)

- When quoting ancient texts, after the first complete quotation you can put the name of the editor after the title of the work, or, if the text is published in a collection, you may use the number of the volume in the collection:

Ruf. *Apol. adv. Hier.* 2,7 (CCL 20), 80 OR Ruf. *Apol. adv. Hier.* 2,7, ed. SIMONETTI, 80

Epistula Petri (CSCO.Ae 101-102), 157 (text), 68 (transl.) OR *Epistula Petri*, ed. BAUSI, 157 (text), 68 (transl.)

III. Abbreviations for ancient names and works

Books of ancient works should be quoted in Roman numerals: Eusebius, *Historia ecclesiastica* IV (OR Eus. *H.e.* IV). Chapters or paragraphs as well are to be indicated with Arabic numerals: Eusebius, *Historia ecclesiastica* IV 3,2 (OR Eus. *H.e.* IV 3,2).

You may refer to ancient authors and texts according to two systems:

- 1) you mention the name of the author, put semicolon, and mention the title of the work in italic, either in your language or in Latin (Theodoret, *History of the Church* II 3,4 OR Theodore, *Historia ecclesiastica* II 3,4)

2) You may abbreviate the names of authors and titles of works according to the following systems, but pay attention to the fact that the first abbreviated word of the title should begin with a capital (*Apol. adv. Hier.* and **not** *apol. adv. Hier.*):

1. Full quotations of biblical books must be in Italic, while abbreviated forms remain in Roman. For the abbreviation system, follow the conventions of your language. Italian contributor are requested to follow the system of abbreviations of the “Bibbia di Gerusalemme”, using the colons as follows: Gen 1,2 (not Gen 1.2 or Gen 1:2); Gen 1,2-6; Gen 1-26.8.

2. For Latin authors and texts, including Christian ones (**with the exception of Augustine**), see the abbreviations in *Thesaurus linguae latinae*. Augustine's works are to be quoted according to *Augustinus-Lexikon*:

3. For Greek authors and texts, see the list in the [Greek-English Lexicon](#) by Liddell-Scott-Jones (also [Online abbreviations](#) [<http://www.stoa.org/abbreviations.html>]).

4. For Greek Jewish and Christian authors and texts (**with the exception of Philo and Origen**), see Lampe's *Patristic Greek Lexicon*, Oxford 1969.

For Philo, quote his works according to *Studia Philonica Annual*:
