BRIEF OVERVIEW OF THE ERASMUS MUNDUS JOINT MASTER IN GREENING ENERGY MARKET AND FINANCE (GrEnFin-EMJM)

The GrEnFin-EMJM is a 24-month Erasmus Mundus Joint Master's programme, organized by three leading universities: the University of Bologna (UNIBO), Ludwig-Maximilian University (LMU), and Paris-Dauphine University (UPD). This high-quality international study programme spans three different countries, as outlined in the mobility plan, with significant Erasmus Mundus scholarships available for top students worldwide.

The educational programme is designed to meet the needs of society and the labor market by equipping stakeholders in the Energy Sector (including energy providers, private companies, and research institutes) with highly interdisciplinary professionals capable of addressing the evolving challenges of the transition to a low-carbon economy.

The programme offers three specialized tracks:

- Engineering of Renewable Resources (RENEWABLE TECHNOLOGIES track)
- Environmental Finance (ENVIRONMENTAL FINANCE track)
- Energy-Climate Economics for the Business Sector (CLIMATE&BUSINESS track)

Each track follows a specific mobility schedule and a detailed educational programme organized by semester and disciplinary area, as outlined in the table below.

The GrEnFin-EMJM programme offers 120 ECTS credits and leads to a multiple degree conferred by the three partner universities. Upon successful completion, students will receive a second-cycle multiple degree, consisting of three diplomas, along with diploma supplements from each institution. The awarded degrees are:

- Master's Degree in Greening Energy Market and Finance from the University of Bologna (UNIBO)
- Master's Degree in Financial and Insurance Mathematics from Ludwig-Maximilian University (LMU)
- Master's Degree in Economics and Finance from Paris-Dauphine University (UPD)

1. HOW TO ACCESS THE PROGRAMME

The Admission Board is responsible for thoroughly reviewing candidates' academic backgrounds to assess their eligibility for admission. This board is composed of esteemed professors from the three partner institutions, ensuring a comprehensive evaluation process that aligns with the programme's high standards. Their collective expertise will facilitate a fair and rigorous assessment of each candidate's qualifications.

Admission will be granted based on a **limited number of spots, set at 51 for the 2026-27 academic year**, with an equitable distribution of 17 spots for each track. Any exceptions to this limit will be assessed by the Admission Board, considering specific qualifications of candidates in relation to the sustainability of the programme for the partner HEIs.

3. RECIPIENTS OF THIS NOTICE

3.1 Recipients

This notice is addressed to all candidates coming from EU and NON-EU countries (Member States of the European Union, Third countries associated to the programme and Third countries not associated to the programme) who, being in possession of the admission requirements set out in Section 4, intend to enrol in the GrEnFin-EMJM.

3.2 Information for graduating students

Candidates who are about to graduate may also apply. They will be evaluated, and they may possibly matriculate for the GrEnFin-EMJM provided they obtain their undergraduate degree by and **no later than July 24, 2026** (consider that for Environmental Finance track, students with degrees from China, India and Vietnam will be asked to provide the APS certificate by July 15, 2026). Candidates who do not meet this requirement will not be able to complete the matriculation to the GrEnFin-EMJM and any registration will be cancelled. Any vacant places will be allocated to students on the waiting list.

3.3 Information for international students



Specific procedures are foreseen for:

- ▶ **Students with a foreign qualification**, regardless of citizenship
- ▶ **Non-EU citizens with EU equivalent status**
- ▶ **Non-EU citizens with residency abroad**

4. PROGRAMME ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

In order to be admitted to the GrEnFin-EMJM you must possess:

1. the required academic qualification (see *Section 4.1*);
2. specific curricular requirements (see *Section 4.2*);
3. specific language requirements (see *Section 4.3*);
4. adequate personal competencies and skills, verified according to the criteria laid down by the programme (see *Section 4.4*).

4.1 Qualifications

- ▶ First cycle academic qualification: three-year university diploma or degree
or

- ▶  Qualification obtained abroad recognised as suitable under Italian law, current international agreements and the rules laid down in the MUR Circular "Procedures for entry, residency and enrolment of international students and the respective recognition of qualifications for higher education courses in Italy" for A.Y. 2026/2027, which will be published on <https://www.universitaly.it/studenti-stranieri>.

Candidates who are about to graduate may also apply. They will be evaluated, and they may possibly matriculate for the GrEnFin-EMJM provided they obtain their undergraduate degree **by and no later than July 24, 2026**. (see *Section 3.2*).

4.1.a. What happens if you do not have the necessary qualification

If you do not have the necessary academic qualification and do not fall under the cases dealt with in *Section 3.2 - 'Information for graduating students'*, you will not be able to register for the GrEnFin-EMJM.

4.2 Curricular requirements

In order to be eligible for the GrEnFin-EMJM, candidates must have a Bachelor's degree in one of the following fields: Mathematics, Physics, Economics, Statistical Sciences, Information Technology, Engineering.

Candidates holding an Italian qualification must have obtained the Bachelor's degree in one of the following classes or possess another qualification obtained abroad recognized as suitable:

- ex. Italian Ministerial Decree n. 270/04: L 7 Civil and Environmental Engineering, L 8 Information Technology Engineering, L 9 Industrial Engineering, L 18 Business Administration, L 30 Physics, L 31 Computer Science, L 33 Economics, L 35 Mathematics, L 41 Statistics.

- ex. Italian Ministerial Decree n. 509/99: classe 8 (Ingegneria Civile e Ambientale), classe 9 (Ingegneria dell'informazione), classe 10 (Ingegneria industriale), classe 17 (Scienze dell'economia e della gestione aziendale), classe 25 (Scienze e Tecnologie Fisiche), classe 26 (Scienze e Tecnologie Informatiche), classe 28 (Scienze Economiche), classe 32 (Scienze Matematiche), classe 37 (Scienze Statistiche).
- Previous four-year degree programme system: degree in Mathematics, Physics, Economics, Statistical Sciences, Information Technology, Engineering.

In any case, the eligibility to the GrEnFin-EMJM depends on the assessment of qualifications by the Admission Board. The assessment is made on the basis of the curricular and extracurricular experiences and the criteria specified below.

4.2.a. What happens if you do not meet the curricular requirements

If you do not meet the curricular requirements indicated, you will not be able to register for the programme.

4.3 Language requirements

English language skills are required to **at least CEFR level B2**.

4.3.a. How to fulfil the language requirement

The English language requirement is fulfilled during the **application phase** through:

- Submission of a **suitable certificate**. The list of recognized certificates is published at the following link: <https://site.unibo.it/grenfin-emjm/en/application>

4.4 Adequate personal competences and skills

Eligibility to the GrEnFin-EMJM is in any case subject not only to possession of the curricular requirements indicated above, but also to verification of adequate personal competences and skills, carried out as indicated below.

4.4.a. How the adequacy of personal competences and skills is verified

- a. **Academic merit** (duration and quality of degree course attended as well as the final graduation score obtained, all certified by the transcript).

The Admission Board will examine the documentation submitted at the application phase, which refers to the information reported by the candidate in the official template “**ISCED classification Template**” (International Standard Classification of Education) available at the following link <https://site.unibo.it/grenfin-emjm/en/application>. The Admission Board may check the correspondence between the data declared and the supporting documents: **max 50 points**

- b. **Overall experience (curricular and extracurricular) related to the field of study**, provided through the official template available at the following link <https://europass.europa.eu/en>: max 20 points
- c. In order to prove the adequacy of your personal competences and skills, you will also be required to submit a **GRE certificate taken in person and issued no more than two years prior to the deadline of the call**: max 30 points

Submitting all required documents is mandatory; therefore, candidates who do not submit one or some of the certificates/documents required will be automatically excluded from the evaluation.

Only candidates who reach a **minimum of 60 points will be considered eligible**.

- d. Applicants who achieve a total score **equal to or higher than 80 across points a, b, and c** will be **invited to an interview**, preferably held in person at one of the partner institutions (Bologna, Munich, Paris). Alternatively, justified reasons may allow for the interview to be conducted online. The interview will be both exploratory and evaluative, including an assessment of the candidate's academic preparation and finalized to define the Erasmus Mundus scholarship attribution. The date of the interview will be communicated by e-mail sent to the institutional e-mail address (@studio.unibo.it).

Applicants who are invited to the interview and do not attend it will be automatically excluded from the scholarship attribution.

4.4.b. What happens if my personal competences and skills do not meet the adequacy criteria

If you obtain a final score of less than 60 points, your personal competencies and skill will be deemed unsuitable, and you will not be able to register for the programme.

Eligible students are not deemed to be admitted to the course if they do not qualify for the places available.

5. HOW TO APPLY

Within the period set for the GrEnFin-EMJM intake (see *Schedule of Procedures - Section 2*) you can apply by following the steps below.

1. **Log on to Studenti Online** (www.studenti.unibo.it)

If you are accessing for the first time, choose '**Register**' and log in with SPID or CIE. The system will automatically retrieve your personal details and create your University credentials (name.surname@studio.unibo.it).



*If you reside abroad and do not have an identity document issued in Italy you may log on with the University username and password, which can be obtained by going to Studenti Online (www.studenti.unibo.it) and clicking on “**Register**” and then “**International students registration**”.*

2. Click on "**Admission application**", select "Second Cycle Degree Programme". **Each student can apply for one and just one of the following tracks:**

3. **Upload the following documents in PDF** (only “ISCED classification template”, see below, will be an Excel file):

► **COMPULSORY DOCUMENTS**

a. Front and back copy of a **valid identity document**



If you are a citizen of a foreign country and your identity document does not have an English translation: copy of your passport;

b. **Fill in the mandatory template “ISCED classification Template”** (including 4 sheets, at the bottom: “Guide” with instructions for completion followed by the three subsequent sheets to be filled in) available at the following link along with the “**ISCED code guide**”: <https://site.unibo.it/grenfin-emjm/en/application>.

c. Copy of the **qualification** obtained (**degree and transcript of records**).

If the qualification is obtained in Italy: self-certification of the first-level academic qualification with a list of exams taken.



If the qualification is not obtained in Italy: a copy of the qualification not obtained in Italy, translated into English, allowing access in the country of attainment to Second Cycle Degree Programmes, accompanied by a transcript of records and Diploma Supplement where available.

If you have not yet obtained the qualification, upload the list of exams taken (Transcript of Records).

- e. **Overall experience (curricular and extracurricular)** using the European template available at the following link: <https://europass.europa.eu/en> .
- f. Copy of your **unofficial GRE score report**.
- g. Send your **official GRE score report through ETS**. The official score must be received by the University of Bologna no later than 08/01/2026 under penalty of nullity. Official scores received after this deadline will not be considered. **The recipient code of the University of Bologna to send your official score report is 7850.**

► **OPTIONAL DOCUMENTS:**

- A copy of a valid **residence permit**, if already held.

The committee will only assess documents uploaded through the Studenti Online application (www.studenti.unibo.it).

Any mandatory documents (including the “Erasmus Mundus Joint Master declarations”) that are missing or only partially uploaded by the application deadline shall result in the candidate not being considered.

Documents must not be sent by post or e-mail to the administrative offices.

In the event of false declarations, in addition to incurring the penalties laid down in Article 496 of the Italian Criminal Code, you will automatically forfeit your right to registration and any benefits obtained, without being entitled to any reimbursement of the sums paid.

ERASMUS MUNDUS JOINT MASTER SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Candidates applying for an EMJM scholarship must consider that: the scholarship can only be awarded to full-time students; students who have previously obtained an EMJM scholarship are not eligible to apply for an additional scholarship under the EMJM; in the case they receive an EMJM scholarship they will not benefit from another EU funded scholarship scheme to follow the same EMJM course and this for the entire GrEnFin-EMJM study period.

Candidates will be required to accept the above-mentioned awarding conditions at the application stage. The consequence in case of false declarations will be the reimbursement

of scholarships unduly paid. The Education, Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA) will perform regular checks to ensure the respect of the above-mentioned rule.

6. VERIFICATION OF APPLICATIONS AND PUBLICATION OF THE RESULTS

6.1 Admission Board

A committee (Admission Board) will check the candidates' personal competencies and skills and that they meet the requirements for admission. It is composed of esteemed professors from the three partner institutions, ensuring a comprehensive evaluation process that aligns with the programme's high standards. Their collective expertise will facilitate a fair and rigorous assessment of each candidate's qualifications.

6.2 Results of the checks

The results of your application will be published on Studenti Online (www.studenti.unibo.it) and sent to your institutional e-mail address (name.surname@studio.unibo.it), as from the date indicated in the Schedule of Procedures (*see Section 2*). You will be invited to accept the place following a pre-enrolment procedure within the deadline indicated in *Section 2*.

The results will be either

- ▶ **"admitted"**: in this case you can register for the programme;
- ▶ **"not admitted "**: in this case you cannot register for the programme.

Admitted students will be promptly informed about the requirement **to hold a valid Visa or residence permit**, in accordance with the mobility plan for their assigned track. This will ensure compliance with the immigration regulations in force in the country where they will be undertaking their mobility.

SELECTION FOR THE ERASMUS MUNDUS JOINT MASTER SCHOLARSHIP

As the Admission Board has evaluated the candidates, the allocation of scholarships will be based on a single ranking that involves all three tracks to enhance the merit of admitted candidates regardless of their pathway preferences. The scholarships will be given separately to EU Member States and Third countries associated to the program as well as Third countries not associated to the program and NDICI countries. Geographical balance is required by the Erasmus Mundus rules so no more than 10% of the total number of scholarships will be awarded to candidates from the same nationality (unless they come from targeted regions of the world). Students will be notified about the scholarship attribution starting from the date specified in the Schedule of Procedures (*see Section 2*).

Students will be invited to accept the scholarship along with their place within the same deadline specified in the Schedule of Procedures (*see Section 2*).

7. MATRICULATION UNDER CONDITION and FINALISATION OF MATRICULATION

MATRICULATION UNDER CONDITION

- *for self-paying students: Steps 1, 2 and 3 with payment of the first instalment*
- *for EM scholarship holders: Steps 1 and 2 only*

All admitted students (EMJM scholarship-holders or not) who have accepted the place through the pre-enrollment procedure must finally matriculate at UNIBO (Steps 1 and 2). All non-scholarship holders must also proceed with the payment of student participation costs upon enrolment at UNIBO (Step 3).

All admitted students will also be required to matriculate/register at the higher education institutions included in the specific mobility plan for their track, fulfilling all local administrative obligations.

Students will have to matriculate at UNIBO via Studenti Online (www.studenti.unibo.it) and should complete the following steps:

1. **Log on to Studenti Online (www.studenti.unibo.it)** using your SPID or CIE credentials or entering the username and password you obtained during the application procedure.
2. **Select "Registration"**, then select **"Second Cycle Degree Programme"**, and then the degree programme **"Greening Energy Market and Finance"**. Then, enter the required data, attaching a jpg file containing a passport-size photo of your face.
In the event of false declarations, in addition to incurring the penalties laid down in Article 496 of the Italian Criminal Code, you will automatically forfeit your right to registration and any benefits obtained, without being entitled to any reimbursement of the sums paid.
3. **Pay the first enrolment instalment of your tuition fees (if you are a self-funded student)** via the PagoPA platform, as indicated on Studenti Online (www.studenti.unibo.it).
4. After you have made your matriculation payment, check under Registration on Studenti Online (www.studenti.unibo.it) what you need to do for the purposes of **identification** and **career activation**.

7.1.a. University identification and career activation

Identification

- ***If you submitted your application by logging in with SPID or CIE:*** after making the payment, your identity will be automatically validated.
- ***If you have submitted your application by logging in with your username and password:*** complete the identification procedure specified under Enrolment on Studenti Online (www.studenti.unibo.it).

FINALISATION OF MATRICULATION with provision of documents

- ▶  **If you are a non-EU citizen and reside abroad**, in compliance with the procedures defined by the Italian Ministry of University and Research in the Circular "Procedures for entry, residency and enrolment of international students and the respective recognition of qualifications for higher education courses in Italy" for A.Y. 2026/2027 which will be published on <https://www.universitaly.it/studenti-stranieri>, in addition to following the steps required for admission to the degree programme, you will have to **pre-enrol on University portal** and request an **entry Visa** for study purposes.

Career activation

Activating your career enables you to take part in all the activities you will carry out as a student (e.g. submitting your study plan, booking exams, carrying out any other procedures related to your career, accessing the Wi-Fi network and online library resources, and using the MyUnibo app).

After identification, career activation will take place automatically, unless you fall into one of the following cases.

- ▶ ***If you have not yet graduated at the time of matriculation***, you must obtain your degree **by 24 July 2026 at the latest**. Otherwise, your matriculation will be cancelled.

If you are graduating from the University of Bologna, the system will automatically update your position once you obtain your degree.

If you are graduating from another university, after matriculating please check on Studenti Online (www.studenti.unibo.it) for any further steps required.

- ▶  ***If you are a non-EU citizen, are resident abroad and have obtained your qualification abroad***: see details at www.unibo.it/EnrollingSecondCycleDegreeProgrammesNonEU. Check the [foreign qualification documentation required to matriculate](#).

Remember that the documentation submitted in your application for admission (e.g. degree, transcript, etc.) must be [translated and its authenticity and value must be verified, where required](#).

In the "Calls" section of Studenti Online (www.studenti.unibo.it), select "**Matriculation A.Y. 26_27 - document upload for international students with foreign qualifications**" and upload your qualification diploma and a copy of your entry Visa for study purposes. When you arrive in Italy, **during the Welcome Week** held in Bologna, an appointment with the International Student Administration Office will be made in order **to show the original copies of your documentation**.

Warning: if you have a foreign qualification, admission to the programme and any subsequent conditional or unconditional validation of your pre-enrolment by the University do not confer any right to finalise your matriculation, even in the event of obtaining an entry Visa, being physical present in the country, becoming eligible for and/or actually receiving scholarships or contributions of any kind.

For matriculation purposes, it will be necessary to verify the actual suitability of the foreign qualification, and the authenticity of the submitted documentation.

Your qualification will be formally checked by the International Student Administration Office in Bologna after paying the first matriculation instalment (for non-EM scholarship holders) and **submitting the original copies of all the required documentation.**

During the Welcome week held in Bologna at the beginning of September, all admitted students will have the opportunity to meet with the Faculty members responsible for the various tracks and to learn about all the opportunities offered by the program, as well as the flexibility and customization options available in their academic journey. Additionally, students will receive support in completing the administrative procedures necessary for finalizing their enrollment, in compliance with EU and any local requirements.

Once the students' career is active, they will be sent an e-mail with a QR code allowing them to print their badge.

8. FEES AND BENEFITS

8.1 University fees for self-funded students (non-Erasmus Mundus scholarship holders)

Information on **tuition fees** and on **benefits and exemptions** is published annually on the University Portal at www.unibo.it/tuitionfees.

The fee to be paid to enrol for a degree programme consists of a fixed element of € 157.04 and a variable element calculated according to the student's family's financial situation (ISEE) up to a maximum that varies according to the programme.

Your tuition fees will be calculated on a progressive scale based on a valid **ISEE certificate** only if submitted in accordance with the terms and procedures set out on the web page www.unibo.it/tuitionfees. If you do not submit an ISEE certificate, you will have to pay the full tuition fees relevant to your degree programme.

Submission of an ISEE certificate is independent of programme enrolment. The order in which you carry out the two procedures is irrelevant, as long as you comply with the deadlines set for each.



Please note!

International students who only have income and assets abroad cannot submit an ISEE certificate, but must refer to the information at www.unibo.it/en/study/enrolment-fees-and-other-procedures/degree-programmes/tuition-fees-and-exemptions/ISEE-and-other-documentation-for-tuition-fee-exemptions.



Please note!

Submitting financial documentation for tuition fee exemptions, following the instructions on www.unibo.it/tuitionfees, is very simple. Remember that if you do not submit the documentation by the deadline, you will not be eligible for any subsidies. The deadline is peremptory, and no exceptions are ever allowed.

8.2 Right-to-higher-education grants provided by ER-GO

Azienda Regionale per il Diritto agli Studi Superiori – ER-GO publishes calls for scholarships, places in university residences, catering and other benefits on its website (www.er-go.it) every year.

The application for ER-GO grants is independent of the degree programme application and enrolment procedures.



Please note!

You must submit your application for an ER-GO grant via the company's website, also entering your ISEE certificate. Applying is very simple. Remember that calls have a peremptory deadline and no exceptions are ever allowed.

8.3 Important information for those who already have an active university career

If you already have an active university career, before transferring from another Italian university or changing programme, if you are already enrolled in a programme at the University of Bologna, carefully consult the merit requirements for access to grants set out in the call published on www.er-go.it because, due to the recognition of university educational credits (CFUs) acquired in your previous career, your position may change as regards access to grants.



Please note!

For all ER-GO benefits, the minimum number of university educational credits required for merit is always determined starting from the year of first enrolment at university (even if for

another University, University Institute or Degree Programme, even abroad), regardless of the year of the programme to which you are admitted following the recognition of your credits, and only those that are recognised on the programme you are enrolled in are considered valid.

For each grant, please carefully read the instructions on how and when to apply. Remember that deadlines are always peremptory and no exceptions are ever allowed.

8.5 Specific grants provided by this degree programme

The **GrEnFin-EMJM** offers for the academic year 2026-2027 a **maximum of 14 full Erasmus Mundus scholarships** to the best-ranked students worldwide. The Erasmus Mundus scholarship will be a contribution to the costs incurred by the beneficiary students and shall cover travel, visa, installation and subsistence costs. It is calculated on the basis of a monthly unit cost of € 1.400 for the entire period needed by the enrolled scholarship holder to complete the study programme (pro-rata of the actual number of days). This period covers study, research, placement activities, thesis preparation and defence, in line with the requirement of the joint Master. During this period, the scholarship can only be awarded in full, and to full-time students. All applicants, wherever they come from, are eligible for an Erasmus Mundus Joint Master (EMJM) scholarship provided they fulfil the academic requirements, as stated by the present Notice and by the Erasmus Mundus rules (*see Section 5*).
