Speaker 1: Héctor Julio Pérez López, Full Professor of Media Aesthetics at the Universidad Politécnica de Valencia (Spain). He is an internationally recognized expert in the study of the narrative and aesthetics of television series.

Her main research interests include: energy consumption, energy certification of buildings and the possibility of improving the energy performance of facilities; indoor air quality and application of renewable energy sources; buildings energy simulation as a tool to optimize technologies used in a way to decarbonization.

Speaker 6: Franco Taroni, Full professor of forensic statistics at the University of Lausanne (Faculty of Law, Criminal Justice and Public Administration, School of Criminal Justice). He develops models for inference and decision-making under uncertainty in forensic science and law. He was awarded grants from the Swiss National Science Foundation and EU Marie Curie Fellowships.

Speaker 12: Lester Tomè Associate Professor at Smith College, Massachusetts. His research, published in major academic collections and journals, focuses on the history of ballet in the 20th and 21st centuries, analyzed within the contexts of modernism, the Cuban Revolution, the Cold War, and contemporary transnationalism. He examines ballet through themes such as the transatlantic circulation of avant-garde aesthetics, connections with other arts and disciplines, dynamics between cosmopolitanism and nationalism, the influence of state ideologies and postcolonial discourse, dancer migration and ballet as labor, representations of racial identity and Afrodiasporic culture, and issues of gender, sexuality, and diversity.

Speaker 7: Audrey Borowski, Research Fellow on the “Desirable Digitalization” project between the Universities of Cambridge and Bonn. Her research is highly interdisciplinary – she aims to straddle different fields (philosophy, media theory, politics, machine learning, etc.), and much of her work seeks to provide a better theoretical and conceptual understanding of digital and algorithmic systems in the hope of reorienting the field, approaching AI and digital systems from a more philosophical, social and political perspective, rather than that afforded by the more specifically applied technological or ethical perspectives that dominate much current research.
