The combination of new technologies and the full involvement of local communities and heritage stakeholders is a powerful solution, aiming at drafting a shared, detailed plan and thus inspiring different parties to join the protection effort. The goal of this workshop is to investigate the diversity of archaeological landscapes in order to propose effective and sustainable strategies for their data-driven analysis, documentation and management within an inclusive approach, both painting them as a heritage and as a resource.
