Abstract: The seminar series delivered by Professor Farnelli on "Litigation in International Investment Law Concerning Environmental Issues" will be composed of three lectures. The first two lectures (5 and 14 May 2025) will provide a broad-brush sketch of the basic features of international investment law and arbitration, on the one hand, and international environmental law, on the other. This, with a view to providing the legal framework relevant for the monographic part of the third lecture (20 May 2025), which will address how environmental Issues may enter investment arbitration both as states' defences and counterclaim, or by claimants as arguments instrumental to evidencing a breach of an investment standard. The EU approach to the indicated topics will constantly be considered.

Prof. Gian Maria Farnelli: Associate Professor at the Department of Legal Studies, University of Bologna. Visiting scholar at the Max Planck Institute for Comparative Public Law and International Law in Heidelberg. *Member of the Italian defence panel in M/V Norstar (TIDM), Allegations of Genocide under the Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide (CIG) and Questions of jurisdictional immunities of the State and measures of constraint against State-owned property (CIG).* Research assistant in interstate and investment litigation. He has published in Italian and English on the Law of the Sea, Investment Law, Law of International Adjudication, Environmental Law, Immunity Law and International Terrorism.
