You are invited to participate in a research study on gender inequalities in time use and their determinants, conducted in the Department of Economic Sciences. In accordance with Article 13 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 (General Data Protection Regulation), please be advised that Alma Mater Studiorum - University of Bologna is the Data Controller and will process personal data in compliance with the requirements of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 (General Data Protection Regulation) and Legislative Decree June 30, 2003, no. 196 and subsequent amendments and integrations (Personal Data Protection Code).

PURPOSE AND METHOD OF PROCESSING

The research project "A time-use observatory on young couples" aims to monitor the evolution of individuals' time use within families with children aged 11 or older, potential gender differences in time use and its determinants, the prevalence of multitasking, and the relationship with the mental workload managed by individual adults within the family. The project will collect data on the list of activities undertaken during two days and some information about individual characteristics, attitudes, and opinions.

The research is conducted within the context of a larger research project carried out by an "extended partnership" consisting of multiple universities and partner organizations, including the University of Bologna (Alma Mater Studiorum), called "GRINS" ("Growing Resilient, Inclusive, Sustainable"), hereinafter referred to as the "GRINS Project," funded by the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (PNRR), Mission 4 (Infrastructure and Research), Component 2 (From Research to Enterprise), Investment 1.3 (Extended Partnerships). The collected data will also be used for the purposes of the GRINS Project, as detailed in this document. Specifically, the data will be processed to contribute to the development of an online data platform called AMELIA ("dAta platform for the transfer of knowLedge and statistIcal Analysis"), enabling access to high-quality data and data analysis tools for various uses by public administrations, businesses, and families. This aligns with the PNRR objectives of promoting resilient, inclusive, and sustainable growth. The collected data, after anonymization, will be transmitted to the entity managing the AMELIA data platform for the purposes of the GRINS Project. In particular, your personal data, including information about the list of activities carried out during two days (one on the weekend and one during the week), time devoted to them, occupation, individual and family income class, age, gender, number and birth date and gender of children, information about family composition, organization of daily life within the family, attitudes and preferences regarding the roles of women/mothers and men/fathers, information on the use of paternity and maternity leave, attitudes regarding stereotypes about the roles of

men/women, attitudes regarding hypothetical couple conflicts, and identifying and contact information will be processed by specifically authorized individuals, with and without the use of automated devices, for the following purposes:

(A1) IDENTIFICATION OF VOLUNTEERS TO BE INVOLVED IN THE RESEARCH

The Data Controller, through its "Data Processor" IPSOS S.R.L., will identify individuals to invite to participate in the research using software that randomly generates phone numbers. Subsequently, the controller will call the obtained phone numbers and, during the call, invite the contacted person to participate in the research.

Participation is voluntary, and in the event that an individual declines to participate in the research, their phone number will be immediately and permanently deleted.

If the contacted person agrees to participate in the research, their data will be processed for the purpose of research participation. For further information on this matter, please refer to the following section.

(A2) PARTICIPATION IN RESEARCH AND RELATED OPERATIONS AND ACTIVITIES.

If you consent to participate in the mentioned research, some of your personal data will be collected through:

- Survey,
- Online survey [accessible at the address provided by IPSOS S.R.L. during data collection].

In the course of the research aiming at the described purpose, more specifically, we will process participants' personal data for these activities: (i) registration of participants on the web platform through which participants complete the questionnaires, acquisition of data entered in the questionnaire completion through the mentioned platform, and other activities related to the technical functioning and maintenance of this platform; (ii) providing participants with necessary instructions on research participation through SMS and email communications; (iii) providing participants with requested online/phone/SMS assistance (assistance activities are managed, on behalf of Unibo, by the provider IPSOS S.r.l).

No directly sensitive data will be collected. However, the response to some questions may indirectly lead to information about your sexual orientation. It should be noted, however, that under no circumstances will authorized personnel (e.g., scientific supervisor and other researchers) process the data with the aim of identifying your sexual orientation.

In pursuit of the research purpose, the already described data of the participant's minor children and the partner of the participant will also be collected.

The information you provide will be processed by researchers from the research team and by IPSOS SRL, which will replace all identification data with a code. Please note that your data will be subject to anonymization only after 8 years. This is because it is in the university's interest to contact you again to delve into certain aspects of the research and to contact you again if you express the desire to participate in potential extensions of the longitudinal research. In particular, the project aims to link the collected information with data available in the INPS archives.

Personal data may be sent to third parties who, as Data Processors under Article 28 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679, assist the Data Controller in managing university information systems and services.

Specifically, the data may be communicated to IPSOS S.R.L., which will handle the data collection and is appointed as the data processing controller, and to any other third parties assisting the controller in anonymizing and integrating the database, aimed at building a research platform in accordance with the open data principles established in EU Directive 2019/1024 of the European Parliament and the Council of June 20, 2019 (http://data.europa.eu/eli/dir/2019/1024/oj) and in compliance with data protection legislation.

The data may also be communicated to INPS to correlate them for research purposes with labor market administrative data.

The data collected and stored for the implementation of this study will be retained for 8 years.

(A3) Information on dissemination

The data will be communicated to third parties and disseminated only in strictly anonymous form, for example, through: data platforms shared with other research teams, scientific publications, aggregated and anonymous statistical reports (indicators), and scientific conferences, meetings with other research teams. In particular, it is worth noting that the project will contribute to feeding the AMELIA platform: the personal data processed in the research will therefore undergo processes of irreversible anonymization – preventing the association of such data with a specific identified or identifiable individual – and, only once anonymized, will be processed for the purposes of the GRINS Project within the context of the AMELIA data platform, managed by the entity overseeing the AMELIA platform. (B) DATA STORAGE FOR FUTURE RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

Considering that new discoveries could indicate unprecedented research opportunities for researchers or allow further studies and research on specific data for the study in question, the collected data may be processed, with your consent, to potentially update the research project by contacting you again in the future. The data processed for this additional purpose will be kept, in non-anonymous form, for a period of 15 years.

It is possible to allow extended storage of non-anonymous data for a period of 15 years from the conclusion of this study for possible future research activities and, if necessary, to contact you again to seek your new specific consent for a new research project. On the other hand, if you refuse to consent to the processing described in this document, the data will be deleted or anonymized immediately upon the expiration of the storage period indicated in point (A2).

(C) ADMINISTRATIVE STORAGE

Your data will also be processed for administrative accounting purposes and kept for the time strictly necessary to achieve such purposes, except for the period of ten years to ensure compliance with tax, accounting, and administrative requirements mandated by the law and, possibly, for a longer term, not determinable in advance, as a consequence of various legal processing conditions (e.g., legal actions that make the processing necessary for more than ten years).

LEGAL BASIS AND NATURE OF DATA PROVISION

The legal basis for the processing of personal data described in point (A1) and, limited to the data of any minor children for whom the data subject does not exercise parental responsibility and the partner of the data subject, in points (A2, A3) (in case the data subject decides to participate in the research) and (B) (in case the data subject decides to authorize the storage of data for future research activities) of the preceding paragraph, is the necessity to pursue a task of public interest or connected to the exercise of public powers vested in the Data Controller (Art. 6, para. 1, letter e), Regulation (EU) 2016/679) and, specifically, the necessity for the Controller to carry out scientific research activities in pursuit of its institutional mission (Art. 2-ter, paragraph 1-bis, Legislative Decree of June 30, 2003, no. 196). Research activities are indeed part of the institutional tasks assigned to the Controller as a public university institution: in this regard, see Article 33 of the Italian Constitution, Law of December 30, 2010, no. 240, as well as the Statute of the Alma Mater Studiorum - University of Bologna. The research "A timeuse observatory on young couples," moreover, as anticipated, is carried out in the context of the GRINS Project, which is funded by the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (PNRR, Mission 4, Component 2, Investment 1.3).

The legal basis for the processing of data in points (A2) and (A3) and (B) of the preceding paragraph, for data other than that of any minor children for whom the data subject does not exercise parental responsibility and the partner of the data subject (including, instead, the data

of minor children for whom the data subject exercises parental responsibility), lies in consent, according to Art. 6, paragraph 1, letter a) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 (General Data Protection Regulation) and, in the case of data falling within special categories, Art. 9, paragraph 2, letter a) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679. Consent to processing for the purposes described above is optional.

However, it is specified that the provision of data for the purposes of points (A2, A3) is not mandatory but essential for the achievement of the described purposes. Refusal to provide them will therefore prevent you from participating in the research in question.

The provision of data for the purposes of letter (B) is optional, not arising from a legal obligation, but it is necessary to allow the storage of data for a longer period than that provided for the conclusion of this study in order to ensure future research activities and, if necessary, to contact you to seek your new specific consent for a new research. Failure to provide data for these purposes will have the sole consequence of the impossibility of realizing what was last described.

The provision of data for the purposes of point (C) is necessary to comply with legal obligations regarding the retention of administrative and accounting documents. In this case, the legal basis is found in Art. 6, paragraph 1, letters c) and e), of Regulation (EU) 2016/679.

RIGHTS OF THE DATA SUBJECT

Subject to the limitations on the exercise of the rights of data subjects as provided for in Articles 2-undecies and 2-duodecies of the Code on the protection of personal data (Legislative Decree 196/03), you, as a participant in the research and therefore as the data subject, may exercise the rights recognized under Articles 15-21 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679. These rights include the right to request access to your personal data, rectification or erasure of the same, as well as the restriction of processing concerning you, the right to object to processing, and the right to data portability.

We also specify that any consent expressed by you is freely given and can be revoked at any time without any disadvantage or prejudice, without affecting the lawfulness of processing based on the consent given before revocation.

Finally, if you believe that the processing of your personal data is in violation of the provisions of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 or Legislative Decree 196/03 and subsequent amendments, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the Garante per la protezione dei dati personali (Italian Data Protection Authority), as provided for in Article 77 of the mentioned Regulation, or to take appropriate legal action (Article 79 of the Regulation).
