- 80 Master's programmes in English (70 in Swedish)
- Only 4 Bachelor's programmes in English (70 in Swedish)
- 800 courses taught in English (2000 in Swedish)
- 5 320 undergraduate and postgraduate degrees every year
- Exchange agreements with nearly 500 foreign universities in 50 countries





- International research collaborations with more than 3 000 universities in the world
- 55% of research is funded by external sources
- Roughly 5 100 academic publications per year
- 7 100 employees (6 000 teachers, researchers and PhD students)

Unit for International Mobility

- Manages university-wide bilateral exchanges with roughly 150 partner universities
- Gives service for **incoming and outgoing students**, eg application, course selection, assistance with residence permits, housing, pre-departure meetings, welcome days
- Works with **recruitment** of fee-paying master students
- Is responsible for university-wide MoUs and Student Exchange Agreements (also assists departments)







Initating a cooperation at UU

MoU (Memorandum of Understanding) and SEA (Student Exchange Agreement)

- Memo with why, how, what (incl funding)
- Memo has to be approved by
 - University Director (university-wide agreements)
 - Head of Department (department-specific agreements)

Unit for Global Cooperation

- Initiates and supports international partnerships primarily in Asia, Africa and Latin America linked to research, education and innovation
 - Connects UU researchers with foreign counterparties
 - Informs about opportunities to finance collaborations and provides support in applications
- Builds networks and strengthens UU's relations with key players in other countries
 - Research funding agencies, ministries, universities, industry, embassies, scholarship organizations
- Contributes to development and capacity building for universities in low and middle income countries
 - Coordinates/partners in Erasmus+ CBHE projects
 - Writes and coordinates Erasmus+ ICM
- Responsible for UU Regional Office in Vietnam

Effective mobility flows management in Asian universities

Uppsala University Yezin Agriculture University

November 2019 – November 2020



To enhance the capacity of Asian Universities in strategizing, promoting and managing students mobility schemes.

This will be accomplished by designing a shared mobility management model that will be described and defined in a Handbook.



- Identification of 3 focus groups
 - Strategies and management of student mobility programs (FG1)
 - Service and quality tools for outbound mobility (FG2)
 - Service and quality tools for incoming mobility (FG3)
- Training of the 3 focus groups at Uppsala University
- Trainings/workshops held at each Asian university to disseminate the outcomes of the training in EU in each partner institution



- Development of the handbook for the management of students mobility
- Validation of the handbook by the consortium
- Cascade training and presentation of the Handbook at national level in the 3 partner countries involving regional universities and the Ministry of Education



- 4.1 Set up the 3 focus groups that will engage to develop and draft the TOOLKIT Handbook for student mobility management
 - Each FG will consist of 9 members including 1 per Asian partner and 2 EU representatives.
- 4.2 Train the trainers Mobility flows
 Selection of the participants to the training of the 3 focus groups at Uppsala University
- 4.3 Organise workshops in each Asian university to institutionalise EU trainings outcomes



- 4.4 Joint development and validation of the TOOLKIT handbook for the management of students mobility
- 4.5 Organisation of cascade training and presentation of the Handbook at national level in the 3 partner countries involving regional universities and the Ministry of Education
