ANNEX 2

Regulations for the disbursement of scholarships

In implementation of the agreement between the Department of Legal Sciences and Squire Patton Boggs Law Firm (UK) LLP, 1 scholarship is made available to students enrolled in at least the third year of a single-cycle master's degree program in law at a university headquartered in Italy or students enrolled in a two-year master's degree program in law at a university headquartered in Italy, to fully cover the registration fee for the Summer School on Cross-border litigation and international arbitration.

Art. 1 Recipients of scholarships

The scholarship of the uninominal value of EUR 325,50 will be awarded to the successful candidate in the selection procedure related to the Summer School on Cross-border litigation and international arbitration and concurrently placed in a useful position in the merit list drawn up on the basis of the following requirements:

1. Weighted average achieved in the course of study on the date of application (without rounding or extra points) (1):

Art. 2. Method and deadline for submitting the application

The application must be received by June 20, 2025 [at micheleangelo.lupoi@unibo.it](mailto:micheleangelo.lupoi@unibo.it), accompanied by the required documentation according to the call for applications (certificate of enrollment in at least the third year of a single-cycle master's degree program in law at a university headquartered in Italy or certificate of enrollment in a two-year master's degree program in law at a university headquartered in Italy, candidate's motivational letter, reference letter signed by university professor of Civil Procedure Law, International Law (public or private), Arbitration Law, valid ID.

Art. 3 Incompatibility

The scholarship funded for participation in the Summer School is incompatible with any other facility or form of funding for participation in the Summer School (INPDAP grants, regional vouchers, etc.).

Article 4 Fulfilments of the scholarship recipient

The scholarship recipient will undertake in writing, by signing of appropriate form prepared by the Summer School's Education Secretariat, to attend the lectures and obtain the relevant certification of participation, under penalty of full payment of the registration and attendance fee no later than June 26, 2024. By the same date, the recipient must also submit the Summer School application form to the Flaminia Foundation.

- (3) Possession of ISEE and ISPE indicators that cannot be attributed to the same band results in the attribution of the band corresponding to the relatively higher indicator.

Failure/incorrect submission of the ISEE and ISPE declaration does not result in exclusion from selection, affecting only the non-scoring for that item
