A first introductory presentation on the **WALADU project and its results actually achieved together with the challenges and goals expected** was given by Dr. Federico Zaina from the UNIBO coordination team. Regarding the WP3 and WP4 Dr. Federico Zaina analyzed the BA courses in Archaeology at the University of Bologna, with a general introduction about the Italian university system. Through the explanation of the Archaeology degree system at the University of



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Bologna, its evaluation system, and the job opportunities it creates, this last presentation aimed at giving additional tools for the creation of new courses and internships (WP3).

Afternoon session

During the afternoon session Dr Sara Pizzimenti gave a lesson of how to manage data from archaeological excavations. She started with the history of methodology in archeological research since the '800, then introducing the new stratigraphic methods and the computer programs that can actually be used to manage stratigraphic data and the related material. She highlighted how this can be helpful if used by students for their researches.

Afterwards, Dr. Sara Pizzimenti continued the lecture about methodology in archaeological research, focusing on topographic data. In particular, she illustrated the use of photogrammetry in archaeological excavation and its utility. The production of a 3D digital model of the stratigraphy of an archaeological excavation can improve the teaching of how to approach the work on the field, as well as the subsequent study of the data recovered.
